**ATLANTA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES
UPCOMING CONCERT SCHEDULE CHANGES**

ASO TO UNVEIL 2020/21 SEASON PROGRAMMING ON MARCH 31

ATLANTA – The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO) today announced the cancellation of all Orchestra performances through May 11, 2020 and will make an announcement about the balance of the season no later than May 1, 2020. The Woodruff Arts Center is closed through April 7, 2020 and Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE events beyond that date are being evaluated and rescheduled on a case-by-case basis. In addition, the ASO will announce the programming for its 2020/21 season and begin subscription renewals on March 31, 2020.

“As we continue to work through concert cancellations in our current season, we realize that we are announcing the 2020/21 season in a time of uncertainty,” said Jennifer Barlament, Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Executive Director. “However, now more than ever, we realize how vital it is to have something to look forward to and once again returning to Symphony Hall will hopefully serve as a beacon of hope.”

The music will go on even if we are not able to take the stage at this time. We are introducing the ASO Virtual Stage, to continue to connect people through the transformative power of music while we’re away. - **Exchange your ticket(s) to an upcoming performance.** We are happy to exchange your ticket(s) for one of the many upcoming Atlanta Symphony Orchestra performances, as well as select Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE concerts of comparable value, based on availability.
- **Receive a credit on your ASO account.** We'll put the funds on your account to use toward another performance this season or next, based on availability. These funds can be used toward single ticket or subscription purchases, as well as select Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE concerts, based on availability.
- **Receive a refund (ticketholders for cancelled concerts only).** If you have tickets for a concert that has been cancelled, you may receive a full refund.
