**THE ATLANTA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA TO RETURN TO PIEDMONT PARK FOR
A LATIN CELEBRATION
THURSDAY, JUNE 22, 2023, AT 7:30PM**

ATLANTA – The **Atlanta Symphony Orchestra** returns to **Piedmont Park** for its Concerts in the Park series on **Thursday, June 22, at 7:30 p.m.** with a free performance on Oak Hill.

ASO Resident Conductor and Music Director of the ASYO Jerry Hou conducts the evening’s program, featuring a celebration of Latin music and composers from around the world, including Astor Piazzolla and Manuel de Falla, among others.

Families are encouraged to arrive early with their picnic dinners, as seating with a good view of the stage is first-come, first-served. Pre-concert activities include a performance by the Community Brass Ensemble, led by ASO Principal Tuba Michael Moore, from 6:30 – 7:00 p.m. Family friendly activities will be hosted by the ASO Education and Community Engagement department. There will also be a merchandise table with ASO branded gear for purchase.

“The Concerts in the Park series is one of the ASO’s most treasured traditions, and we’re excited to be back in Piedmont Park again this summer,” said ASO Executive Director Jennifer Barlament. “ASO musicians and Atlantans alike revel in orchestra music filling Oak Hill. We love playing great music for people of all ages and cannot wait for people across the city to join us for a memorable evening.”

Important Concert Information

- Seating with a direct view of the stage is not guaranteed. Patrons are encouraged to arrive early, as seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. Concert begins at 7:30 p.m.
- The performance will take place at Piedmont Park's Oak Hill, located in the southwest corner of the park.
- There is limited parking at the Atlanta Botanical Gardens Parking Facility, adjacent to Piedmont Park. Patrons are encouraged to carpool, ride MARTA to Arts Center Station or Midtown Station, walk or bike to the event.
- Patrons may bring outside food and beverages into the concert area; however, grills, glass containers and outside alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- Beer, wine and food will be available for purchase on site.
- Pets are not permitted at this event. However, the Piedmont Park Dog Park will be open.
- In the case of inclement weather, check aso.org and ASO social media channels for updates. There is no scheduled rain date.

About Jerry Hou

Born in Taiwan and raised in a small town in Arkansas, Taiwanese-American conductor Jerry Hou had a late start in music. Beginning on trombone in middle school band, Hou went on to work professionally in American and European orchestras before his playing career was ended by injury. He returned to school to study conducting, and is now recognized for his dynamic presence, insightful interpretations, versatility and commanding technique on the podium. ([more](#))

The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO) is in its 78th season with Nathalie Stutzmann as only the fifth Music Director in the history of the Orchestra, and the only woman to ever hold the position. Maestro Stutzmann will continue the ASO's mission of bringing new and exciting composers and guest artists to Atlanta.

The ASO is one of the leading orchestras in the United States, performing more than 150 concerts each year from the Delta Classical, Movies in Concert, Family Concert, and Coca-Cola Holiday series, as well as the Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE concerts and many community and education concerts.

In addition, the ASO performs with the 200+ voice, all-volunteer ASO Chorus, originally founded in 1970 by Robert Shaw, and currently under the Direction of Norman Mackenzie. The chorus was featured on nine of the ASO's Grammy-award winning recordings.
