Many of the ASO's own players step into the spotlight as well, taking on solo roles.

The orchestra belongs to us all, a very human instrument. Humans need beauty — it is our mission to bring it to you. Thank you for your support of our orchestra, and I look forward to seeing you soon.





From Haydn's London Symphony to Walton's choral *Belshazzar's Feast* to three cherished works by Ravel, this series spans centuries and continents in style. Nathalie Stutzmann conducts three performances in this series, with Bruckner and Beethoven Symphonies (No. 4 and No. 7), plus a delightful program of French works paired with one about France—*An American in Paris*.





Hear complex symphonic works written during peak and prime periods of creativity. This series features Beethoven's Symphonies No. 6 and No. 8 under the baton of Nathalie Stutzmann. The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus performs Mozart's Mass in C Minor and longtime ASO collaborator Peter Oundjian conducts Mahler's Symphony No. 7 to complete this series.




