The Atlanta Symphony Orchestra shines like the sun in a program filled with fiery moments from Tchaikovsky symphonies, Brahms dances, Dvořák, Rossini and more, conducted by William R. Langley. Bring friends and family while enjoying free general admission tickets to this all-ages concert.

Experience the seismic rush of world-class musicians performing live with a lineup of classical hits, starting with an energetic Rossini opener. The mighty Atlanta Symphony brass bring the thunder to music from Tchaikovsky's explosive Fourth Symphony, and a sensuous violin solo adds exotic spice to the Arabian adventure *Scheherazade*. As a second set, the powerhouse orchestra delivers high-voltage, heel-kicking Hungarian dances by Brahms and Kodály before finishing strong—Czech style—with Dvořák's Eighth Symphony.
