The ASO's Beethoven Project, led by Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann, presented a bold, year-long journey through Beethoven's symphonic works. Featuring the first eight symphonies, the Triple Concerto, and Missa solemnis, the series offered 18,484 concert goers a rare, immersive experience of Beethoven's artistic evolution performed with passion and artistry by the ASO.
