ATLANTA – This week, Atlanta Symphony Hall announced three incredible performances coming this year, two of which will be accompanied by the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO). YouTube sensation and pop violinist, Lindsey Stirling, hits the Symphony Hall stage with the ASO on Saturday, June 28, 2025. On Wednesday, September 10, 2025, the ASO joins Grammy-nominated folk artist, Andrew Bird, for a special performance of his hit songs. About Lindsey Stirling: Night with the ASO

Few artists embody creativity and innovation quite like Lindsey Stirling. A multi-award-winning electronic violinist, dancer, and New York Times bestselling author, she has captivated audiences worldwide with her high-energy performances and genre-blending sound. Known for her electrifying live shows, Lindsey continues to push boundaries—now stepping into the world of orchestral music, bringing her signature style to grand symphonic settings.

Her latest album, *Duality*, showcases her fearless artistry, blending pop influences, cinematic compositions, and left-of-center pop. Collaborating with top producers like Graham Muron and Lucky West, the album delivers both intricate instrumentals and bold, modern melodies. Songs like "Eye Of The Untold Her," produced by Mako and co-written with Hans Zimmer collaborator Steve Mazzaro, reflect her passion for storytelling through music, while tracks like "Inner Gold" and "Survive" highlight her pop sensibilities.

With a career defined by reinvention, Lindsey's upcoming orchestral shows mark an exciting new chapter—fusing the majesty of symphonic arrangements with her signature energy and movement. As she embarks on this next evolution, she invites fans to experience music in an entirely new way, proving once again that artistry knows no limits.

About Andrew Bird with the ASO

Grammy nominated violinist, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist, Andrew Bird, makes his debut with the Atlanta Symphony. Bird celebrates the 20th anniversary of his acclaimed record *The Mysterious Production of Eggs*. Featuring a top-to-bottom album performance with orchestral arrangements, Bird caps off the performance with a suite of fan-favorite tunes from his near 30-year repertoire.

Andrew Bird is an internationally acclaimed, Grammy-nominated multi-instrumentalist, vocalist, whistler, and songwriter who picked up his first violin at the age of four and spent his formative years soaking up classical repertoire completely by ear. Since beginning his recording career in 1997, Bird has released 17 albums and performed extensively across the globe. He has recorded with the Preservation Hall Jazz Band, appeared as "Dr. Stringz" on *Jack's Big Music Show*, and headlined concerts at Carnegie Hall, Sydney Opera House, Walt Disney Concert Hall, Red Rocks Amphitheatre, and festivals worldwide.

More recently, Bird released a series of site-specific improvisational short films and recordings called *Echolocations*, recorded in remote and acoustically interesting spaces: a Utah canyon, an abandoned seaside bunker, the middle of the Los Angeles River, and a reverberant stone-covered aqueduct in Lisbon. Additionally, Bird hosts an ongoing series of live-streamed performances called Live from the Great Room, putting the creative process on display for fans as he collaborates and converses with friends in a candid, intimate setting.

Andrew Bird with the ASO will be conducted by Jacomo Bairos. This show is presented by Delta Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE and will take place at Symphony Hall on Wednesday, September 10, 2025 at 8:00PM. Tickets go on sale on Friday, April 18 at 10AM at ticketmaster.com.
