Fortune Feimster: Takin' Care of Biscuits Tour

Affable, charismatic and one of a kind, Fortune Feimster is a standup comedian, writer and actor who uses her confessional comedy to bring people together. Through laughter and storytelling, Fortune shows audiences of all ages, backgrounds, and sexual orientations that common ground is only a joke or two away. Viewers really got to know Fortune through her first Netflix special, "Sweet & Salty," which was nominated for a Critics Choice Award. With her last special "Good Fortune" and her *Live Laugh Love Tour*, she expands further into her storytelling brand of comedy, hilariously delving into love, relationships, sexuality, and shared experiences with Southern charm and the perspective of someone who grew up in the 1980s. She's your funniest cousin who isn't afraid to entertain the masses with tales of her good fortune, insecurities, and faux pas, including meeting her spouse in a parking lot, falling in love and her extravagant proposal that didn't quite go as planned. Now streaming on Netflix, Good Fortune has earned praise from both fans and critics with the *LA Times* naming it to their Best of List for 2022 and also scored a nomination at the Critics Choice Awards. Fortune just filmed her third special for Netflix in Seattle, WA.

Justin Willman: One for the Ages Tour

Fresh off the release of *Magic Lover*—Netflix's first-ever magic comedy special—Justin Willman is hitting the road with an *all-new* tour: One for the Ages.

Willman is best known as the star and creator of Netflix's *Magic for Humans* and *Magic Prank Show*, where his signature mix of mind-blowing magic and relatable humor has made him a streaming favorite, a viral hit (1 billion views and counting), and a fan favorite for families, comedy lovers, and skeptics alike.

ONEW is a South Korean singer and the leader of the K-pop group SHINee. Known for his warm and emotive vocals, he has been the heart of SHINee's sound through iconic hits like "Replay," "Ring Ding Dong," "View," and "Sherlock (Clue + Note)," which ranked No. 6 on Billboard's "100 Greatest K-Pop Songs of the 2010s." He also played a key role in The Story of Light: Epilogue, selected for Billboard's "25 Greatest K-Pop Albums of the 2010s."

As a solo artist, ONEW has built a distinct musical identity with albums such as Voice (2018), DICE (2022), and Circle (2023)—the latter ranked No. 1 on Billboard's Best K-Pop Albums of 2023. In 2024, he released FLOW], followed by CONNECTION in 2025, led by the single "Winner." These works captured his ongoing artistic evolution and were accompanied by the ONEW THE LIVE: CONNECTION tour across Korea, Japan, and the United States.

Now, in 2025, ONEW marks a major milestone with the release of his second full-length album, PERCENT, on July 15. The project explores themes of connection, sincerity, and the emotional nuances he has developed throughout his career. Preceded by the pre-release single

"Confidence" (June 24), Percent (%) sets the stage for his first-ever world tour across 16 countries in Asia, Latin America, Europe, and the United States. After visiting Europe and Latin America in November, the tour will continue into January 2026 with shows in major U.S. cities including San Jose, Los Angeles, Chicago, New York, and Atlanta.

And with it begins his next chapter — [ONEW THE LIVE: PERCENT (%)]. Onew, the artist who touches hearts with the resonance of his voice and sings with sincerity. Because no one can reach 100 alone, we believe each person's "percent" comes together to create true meaning. After a sold-out national tour, Berner and DeSorbo recently released their book *How to Giggle: A Guide to Taking Life Less Seriously* via Simon and Schuster, which debuted at #2 on the New York Times Best Seller list.

Her video series, *Han on the Street,* has earned over 350 million views. Jazz at Lincoln Center is led by Chairman Clarence Otis, Managing and Artistic Director Wynton Marsalis, and Executive Director Greg Scholl.

The Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra (JLCO), comprising 15 of the finest jazz soloists and ensemble players today, has been the Jazz at Lincoln Center resident orchestra since 1988 and spends over a third of the year on tour across the world. Featured in all aspects of Jazz at Lincoln Center's programming, this remarkably versatile orchestra performs and leads educational events in New York, across the U.S. and around the globe; in concert halls; dance venues; jazz clubs; public parks; and with symphony orchestras; ballet troupes; local students; and an ever-expanding roster of guest artists. Under Music Director Wynton Marsalis, the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra performs a vast repertoire, from rare historic compositions to Jazz at Lincoln Center-commissioned works, including compositions and arrangements by Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Fletcher Henderson, Thelonious Monk, Mary Lou Williams, Dizzy Gillespie, Benny Goodman, Charles Mingus, and current and former Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra members Wynton Marsalis, Wycliffe Gordon, Ted Nash, Victor Goines, Sherman Irby, Chris Crenshaw, and Carlos Henriquez.

Sutton Foster is a Tony Award-winning actress, singer, and dancer who can currently be seen reprising her role as Princess Winnifred in *Once Upon a Mattress* for a limited run at the Ahmanson Theatre in Los Angeles, following an acclaimed turn in the Broadway revival at the

Hudson Theatre. Sutton's turn in the musical's esteemed revival run began with the critically adored adaptation at the New York City Center Encores! in early 2024. Prior, Sutton was seen starring as Mrs. Lovett in the Tony Award-winning Broadway revival of *Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street* opposite Aaron Tveit at the Lunt-Fontanne Theatre.

The two-time Tony-winning actress starred as Marian Paroo in the 2022 Broadway Revival of *The Music Man* at the Winter Garden Theatre. Her performance earned her seventh Tony award nomination as well as the coveted 2022 Drama League Distinguished Performance Award.

As a solo artist, Sutton has toured the country with her hit solo concert, which featured songs from her debut solo CD "Wish" as well as her follow-up CD, "An Evening with Sutton Foster: Live at the Cafe Carlyle." She has also graced the stages of Carnegie Hall, Feinstein's, Lincoln Center's American Songbook series and many others. Sutton released her third solo album, "Take Me to the World," through Ghostlight Deluxe, June 1, 2018. Sutton Foster holds an honorary doctorate from Ball State University, where she also teaches.

Drew & Ellie Holcomb: Never Gonna Let You Go Tour

There are no strangers at a Drew Holcomb show. For nearly two decades, the award-winning songwriter has turned each performance into a celebration of community, collaboration, and contemporary American roots. *Strangers No More*, the band's eighth album, captured this spirit and spun the #1 Americana song, "Find Your People"—a track that was synced in multiple national campaigns, including a Super Bowl commercial for Publix. The Neighbors also

showcased their heartfelt connection when they performed live at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade.

After an 8-year journey alongside her husband's band, Ellie Holcomb's solo debut, *As Sure As The Sun*, earned her Top 10 radio success and a GMA Dove Award for *New Artist of the Year*. Her third solo full-length, *CANYON*, further established her voice with another Top 10 radio single, "I Will Carry You." A best-selling author, Ellie has moved over 600,000 books, including several children's titles and a devotional. Her dedication to creative excellence has earned her four GMA Dove Awards to date. Her upcoming studio album, Far Country, releases on September 12th.

Their first-ever duo album, *Memory Bank*, became the longest-charting release at Americana radio and was the soundtrack to their sold-out North American tour, further affirming their unique synergy and appeal. The *Never Gonna Let You Go Tour* brings Drew and Ellie back to those intimate, connection-driven evenings—melding original storytelling, harmony-rich performances, and the warmth that has made their music a fixture in fans' hearts.

Laurie Berkner: The Greatest Hits Solo Tour

One of the most popular children's entertainers in the U.S., Laurie Berkner has filled countless venues nationwide with adoring fans. With more than a billion total streams, an average of more than 22 million monthly streams, more than 535 million YouTube channel views, and millions of CDs and DVDs sold, Laurie's songs are beloved by families worldwide. The first artist to ever appear in music videos on Noggin, Laurie Berkner appeared regularly on the network's *Jack's Big Music Show* and helped develop the short-form animated musical preschool series *Sing It, Laurie!* on the Universal Kids channel (formerly SproutTV).

Vast Scandinavian snowfields and impenetrable pine forests meet a blazing musical spirit in Jean Sibelius's alluring Symphony No. 5. British maestro Nicholas Collon, chief conductor of the Finnish Radio Symphony, makes his Atlanta Symphony Orchestra debut, along with the young cello firebrand Kian Soltani. Witness Soltani's superhuman artistry as he tackles Lutosławski's blisteringly virtuosic Cello Concerto. The concert opens with the ASO debut of Outi Tarkiainen's mystical symphonic poem *The Ring of Fire and Love*.

Kenny Wayne Shepherd: Ledbetter Heights 30th Anniversary Tour

Thirty years ago, a young Kenny Wayne from Shreveport, Louisiana – armed with a Fender Strat – brought the blues roaring back into the mainstream. With fiery fretwork, pop-rock hooks, and a deep reverence for the genre, Shepherd's debut album, *Ledbetter Heights*, became a breakout success - going Gold within months, Platinum by early 1996, and eventually landing the guitarist at No. 3 on Guitar World's list of top blues artists, behind only B.B. King and Eric Clapton. "In a lot of ways, this is the album that gave me everything," says Shepherd. "Revisiting it put me back in touch with the wonder and excitement of those days. I didn't know what lay ahead. I just knew I loved playing the blues."

Originally recorded while Shepherd was still in high school, *Ledbetter Heights* was the culmination of years spent absorbing Stevie Ray Vaughan and Jimi Hendrix licks on cassette, then translating them into a sound all his own. He wrote or co-wrote nearly every track on the record - uncommon for a teenage blues guitarist at the time - and named the album in honor of an historic neighborhood in his hometown, paying tribute to local blues legend Huddie "Lead Belly" Ledbetter. The album catapulted Shepherd into the national spotlight and set the tone for a career that's seen him tour with the likes of Bob Dylan, Van Halen, The Rolling Stones, and Lynyrd Skynyrd; earn five GRAMMY nominations; and release a string of chart-topping albums that bridge blues tradition with modern rock swagger.

Inscribed with the words "Glory to God alone," Johann Sebastian Bach's immersive Mass weaves dazzling radiance and gnawing expressivity together into buoyant choruses, rich textures, and arresting vocal solos. Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann, one of the great interpreters of this exalted work, leads a stellar lineup of soloists with the renowned Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and Chorus.

Later, that music lit a fire in the genius orchestrator Maurice Ravel to create one of the best-loved works in the concert hall. Experience Mussorgsky's *Pictures at an Exhibition* through the dynamic power of a world-class orchestra. Guest conductor Kevin John Edusei leads the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra in the heel-kicking Hungarian folk suite *Dances of Galanta*. In between, the ASO welcomes violin soloist Isabelle Faust for the elegiac Violin Concerto No. 2 by Bela Bartók. "Always the sound of [Isabelle Faust's] violin floats with a smile through the music." When you see Dionne Warwick perform, you know you're in the presence of pop-music royalty. This is a woman who's remained one of America's top hitmakers throughout multiple eras, contributing classic songs one after another. At the same time, Warwick radiates the warmth that lies at the core of her legendary hits, and for all of her undeniable elegance, her onstage presence couldn't be more natural and down-to-earth. Despite the many decades Warwick has been bringing her unique brand of pop to the stage and studio, her sultry, hypnotic voice remains undiminished. Hearing her deliver songs she made famous, like "I Say a Little Prayer" and "What the World Needs Now Is Love," is like opening a love letter from another era that bears just as much of an emotional impact today as it did back then.

Pat Metheny: Sideeye III+

Pat Metheny continues the evolution of Side-Eye with a new tour featuring new music. The lineup includes pianist/keyboardist Chris Fisherman, drummer Joe Dyson, and Jermaine Paul on

bass. Pat Metheny was born in Lee's Summit, MO on August 12, 1954 into a musical family. Starting on trumpet at the age of 8, Metheny switched to guitar at age 12. By the age of 15, he was working regularly with the best jazz musicians in Kansas City, receiving valuable on-the-bandstand experience at an unusually young age. Metheny first burst onto the international jazz scene in 1974. Over the course of his three-year stint with vibraphone great Gary Burton, the young Missouri native already displayed his soon-to-become trademarked playing style, which blended the loose and flexible articulation customarily reserved for horn players with an advanced rhythmic and harmonic sensibility: a way of playing and improvising that was modern in conception but grounded deeply in the jazz tradition of melody, swing, and the blues. With the release of his first album, Bright Size Life (1975), he reinvented the traditional "jazz guitar" sound for a new generation of players. Throughout his career, Pat Metheny has continued to redefine the genre by utilizing new technology and constantly working to evolve the improvisational and sonic potential of his instrument.

Metheny's versatility is nearly without peer on any instrument. Over the years, he has performed with artists as diverse as Steve Reich to Ornette Coleman to Herbie Hancock to Jim Hall to Milton Nascimento to David Bowie. Metheny's body of work includes compositions for solo guitar, small ensembles, electric and acoustic instruments, large orchestras, and ballet pieces and even the robotic instruments of his Orchestrion project, while always sidestepping the limits of any one genre.

Samara Joy with the ASO

A native of the Bronx, Samara Joy became entranced by classic R&B as a child and cut her teeth as a singer in her church's gospel choir. And while her family history is deeply musical—her grandparents helmed the Philadelphia gospel group, the Savettes, and her father, the musician and songwriter Antonio McLendon, has produced, composed and arranged his own astounding original work—she didn't delve into the jazz tradition until college at SUNY Purchase. During her studies there, she won the 2019 Sarah Vaughan International Jazz Vocal Competition, which introduced her to the larger jazz scene as a rising star to watch. She was heard, by audiences and critics alike, as a masterful interpreter of jazz standards and a rightful heiress of the sound, technique and charisma that defined her jazz heroines—including Vaughan, Betty Carter, Abbey Lincoln and Carmen McRae.

Joy released her self-titled debut on the Whirlwind label in 2021, followed a year later by Linger Awhile, her breakout Verve debut, of which Down Beat said, "With this beautiful recording, a

silky-voiced star is born." The album earned her a Grammy for Best Jazz Vocal Album in addition to a headline-making win for Best New Artist. A deluxe edition of the album was released, as well as the EP *A Joyful Holiday*, which took home Grammys for Best Jazz Vocal Album and Best Jazz Performance in 2025. Her new Verve album, *Portrait*, which Joy co-produced with the veteran trumpeter/bandleader and multi-Grammy winner Brian Lynch, showcases the intimate, soulful chemistry she's developed with her touring band, already earning her an NAACP Image Award this year for Best Jazz Album. *Portrait* also spotlights her burgeoning gifts as a lyricist, in ingenious arrangements that meld her thoughtful words with music by Charles Mingus, Sun Ra and her late mentor Barry Harris.

Herb Alpert & The Tijuana Brass

A legendary trumpet player, Herb Alpert's extraordinary musicianship has earned him five #1 hits, nine GRAMMY® Awards, fifteen Gold albums, fourteen Platinum albums and he has sold over 72 million records worldwide. Herb Alpert & The Tijuana Brass propelled his sound into the pop music limelight, at one point outselling The Beatles two to one. In 1966, they achieved the remarkable feat of simultaneously having four albums in the Billboard Top 10 and five in the Top 20.
