ATLANTA – The GRAMMY® Award-winning Atlanta Symphony Orchestra's 2025-26 season begins with a bang in a special concert by piano superstar Lang Lang, and the epic season opener with Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann at the helm. The start of the season features leading guest artists from classical to contemporary including Andrea Bocelli, Ben Folds, Hélène Grimaud, Faye Webster and more, and welcomes the ASO Chorus for the finale of the Beethoven Project. Plus, Delta Classical Concerts and Delta Atlanta Symphony Hall LIVE shows for the whole family, including a Hogwarts-themed Halloween Concert, two Movies in Concert programs and a free performance at Ameris Bank Amphitheatre. Andrew Bird: 20th Anniversary of The Mysterious Production of Eggs with the ASO

With a distinctive sound that resists categorization, GRAMMY® nominated violinist, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist, Andrew Bird, makes his debut with the Atlanta Symphony. Balancing swelling sounds with jazz, folk, and pop melodies in an unforgettable display of unique virtuosity, Bird celebrates the 20th anniversary of his acclaimed record *The Mysterious Production of Eggs*. Featuring a top-to-bottom album performance with orchestral arrangements, Bird caps off the performance with a suite of fan-favorite tunes from his near 30-year repertoire.

Since beginning his recording career in 1997, Andrew Bird has released 18 albums and performed extensively across the globe, headlining concerts at Carnegie Hall, Sydney Opera House, Walt Disney Concert Hall, Red Rocks Amphitheatre, and festivals worldwide. Bird has been a featured TED Talks presenter, a New Yorker Festival guest, and an op-ed contributor for the New York Times. He performed as the Whistling Caruso in Disney's *The Muppets* and scored the FX Series *Baskets*. Shortly after receiving his 2020 GRAMMY® nomination for Best Folk Album, Bird made his professional acting debut in the cast of FX's *Fargo*. In 2025, Bird celebrates the 20th anniversary of his acclaimed record *The Mysterious Production of Eggs* with a limited run of concerts, performing the record for the first time in its entirety alongside a full orchestra.

Chris Botti with the ASO

GRAMMY®-winning trumpeter Chris Botti has been one of the most popular instrumentalists in the world for nearly three decades; he's collaborated with some of the biggest superstars on the planet,

including Sting, Paul Simon, Barbra Streisand, Lady Gaga, Tony Bennett, Frank Sinatra, Aretha Franklin, Bette Midler, Joni Mitchell, Steven Tyler, Andrea Bocelli, Herbie Hancock, Yo-Yo Ma, and others; he's topped the jazz charts with numerous albums, earned multiple Gold and Platinum records, performed with symphony orchestras and on prestigious stages from Carnegie Hall to the Hollywood Bowl to the Sydney Opera House.

In short, Chris Botti really needs no introduction. Yet with his Blue Note Records debut, he's offering one anyway. *Vol.1* is in many ways a fresh start for the trumpeter. Having successfully crossed over from jazz renown to pop stardom, Botti's first album in more than a decade finds him crossing back, with a small group project focused on acoustic jazz and classic standards.

"I turned 60 in 2022, at a time that seemed like a restart for so many things in the world," Botti says. "I wanted to strip away all the orchestral arrangements and special guests and focus more on my playing, the playing of my band, and these jazz classics that we always love playing on stage."

Ben Folds with the ASO

Ben Folds is widely regarded as one of the major music influencers of our generation.

The Emmy-nominated singer-songwriter-composer has created an enormous body of genre-bending music that includes pop albums with Ben Folds Five, multiple solo albums, and numerous collaborative records.

His latest pop solo album *What Matters Most* was released in 2023 to rave reviews and sold-out performances. He recently released his first Christmas album *Sleigher* in time for the 2024 holiday season, and recently record a LIVE album with the National Symphony Orchestra at the Kennedy Center in DC slated for release in 2025.

He currently tours as a pop artist, while also performing with some of the world's greatest symphony orchestras and serving in his 8th year as the first ever Artistic Advisor to the NSO. In his role as Artistic Advisor, Folds curates an ongoing concert series called "Declassified: Ben Folds Presents," which pairs contemporary artists from all genres of music with the NSO. A New York Times Best Selling author and former podcast host, Ben is also working on new compositions for film, tv and theatre. He also frequently guest stars in films and TV.

The tour will feature performances from Bocelli's extensive repertoire, including music in honor of the Holiday Season, with selections from his recent #1 album *A Family Christmas* as well as the Deluxe Edition, his uplifting solo album *Believe*, and a selection of arias, his beloved crossover hits, and famed love songs.

2024 was a landmark year for Andrea Bocelli's as it marked the 30th anniversary of his iconic career. Bocelli released a new *Duets* album, that went #1 on the Classical Music Charts and featured a variety of his most beloved collaborations with Ed Sheeran, Celine Dion, and Luciano Pavarotti, among others, as well as newly recorded tracks with Shania Twain, Chris Stapleton, Karol G, and more. He also released a concert film directed by Sam Wrench, which chronicled his three-day July concert event in Italy. The film *Andrea Bocelli 30: The Celebration* is currently airing on PBS stations in all tour markets.

As one of the most recognizable voices in the entertainment industry and revered by fans internationally, Andrea Bocelli has sold nearly 90 million records worldwide. In addition to his sold-out arena-sized concert events and record-breaking live-streams, Bocelli has shared his talents at many major events including the Olympic Games, the World Cup, and Global Citizen. He has earned a Golden Globe, seven Classical BRITs and seven World Music Awards, plus a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

The ASO will present Disney *Tim Burton's The Nightmare Before Christmas* in *Concert Live-to-Film* featuring the contemporary holiday classic on the big screen in full symphonic glory with GRAMMY®-winning composer Danny Elfman's musical score performed live to the film by ASO. The concert will be performed at Atlanta Symphony Hall on Saturday, November 1 at 7:00pm and Sunday, November 2 at 3:00pm.

Based on an original poem and characters created by Tim Burton, the film was first released as "The Nightmare Before Christmas" in 1993. Directed by Henry Selick (*James and the Giant Peach*), the film follows the earnest-but-misguided adventures of Jack Skellington, Halloween Town's beloved Pumpkin King.

Bored with the same old scare-and-scream routine of Halloween, Jack longs to try something new. Convinced that he can spread the joy of Christmas, and against the advice of Sally, a caring and clever ragdoll, Jack enlists three mischievous trick-or-treaters – Lock, Shock, and Barrel – to kidnap Santa Claus. But Jack's merry mission puts Santa in jeopardy and creates a nightmare for good little boys and girls everywhere. The film is rated "PG."

Music Director Nathalie Stutzmann then taps into the poetic nuances of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra for the Third Symphony by the fervent Romantic Robert

Schumann, hero and mentor to young Brahms. Nicknamed the *Rhenish* Symphony, Schumann's Third evokes sights and sounds along the storied Rhine.

Cody Fry Christmas with the ASO

Cody Fry returns to Symphony Hall this holiday season to reunite with the ASO for a concert sure to be fun for the whole family. Experience the viral sensation as Fry performs songs written and composed by himself, as his father conducts the ASO. This lively and unique performance is sure to captivate any audience.

Cody Fry's music sounds like the moment in your favorite old flick when the film changes from black-and-white to technicolor in a rush of emotion. As his orchestration booms, you practically expect a Golden Age romance to unfold to the narration of his vocals. It's warm enough to make you nostalgic, but Cody always looks forward as a singer, songwriter, composer, producer, arranger, and multi-instrumentalist. Home Alone 2: Lost in New York in Concert with the ASO

The ASO will present *Home Alone 2 Lost in New York Live in Concert* with Award-winning composer John Williams' score performed live to film by a full orchestra. The concert will be led by conductor Susie Seiter and performed at Atlanta Symphony Hall on Saturday, November 29 at 7:00pm and Sunday, November 30 at 3:00pm.

The score for *Home Alone 2 Lost in New York* is an integral part of the film's charm and emotional resonance. The music combines whimsical, light-hearted themes with dramatic, adventurous undertones. Williams' iconic score includes both the playful and suspenseful, action-driven pieces that perfectly complement Kevin's clever escapades and interactions with the burglars. The music heightens the holiday magic of the film while emphasizing the warmth, humor, and thrills of Kevin's adventure in New York.

When clever and mischievous Kevin McCallister (Macaulay Culkin) is separated from his family at the airport, he mistakenly gets on a plane headed for New York City -- while the rest of the McCallisters fly to Florida. Now alone in the Big Apple with enough money to turn it into his own playground, Kevin cons his way into a room at the luxurious Plaza Hotel and begins his usual antics. But Kevin won't be alone for long. The notorious Wet Bandits (Joe Pesci, Daniel Stern), released from jail and still smarting from their last encounter with Kevin, are bound for New York too for a huge holiday heist. Kevin's ready to welcome them with a battery of booby traps the bumbling bandits will never forget! Written and produced by John Hughes and directed by Chris Columbus, "Home Alone 2 Lost in New York" stars Macaulay Culkin, Joe Pesci, Daniel Stern, John Heard, Tim Curry, Brenda Fricker, and Catherine O'Hara.
