ATLANTA SYMPHONY HALL CELEBRATES THE HOLIDAYS WITH BELOVED ATLANTA TRADITIONS AND NEW SEASONAL FAVORITES

ATLANTA – The **Atlanta Symphony Orchestra**'s December concert calendar is full of blockbuster guest artists and audience favorites that offer a way to celebrate the season for everyone with their family and friends—from the powerful chorus leading carols to jazzy holiday tunes and movies in concert. The ASO's celebrated Coca-Cola Holiday Concerts return with one of the ASO's most treasured holiday programs, **Christmas with the ASO.** It returns for four performances with the ASO, Chorus and Morehouse Glee Club on Dec. 9 and 10, featuring favorite hymns, carols, and anthems celebrating the holiday season.

The power of **Handel's** *Messiah* with its magnificent "Hallelujah Chorus" will be felt throughout Symphony Hall as Director of Choruses Norman Mackenzie leads the Orchestra and the ASO Chamber Chorus in part one of the *Messiah* on Dec. 14 and 15.

Irish singing sensations **Celtic Woman** presents *A Christmas Symphony with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra* on Thursday and Friday, Dec. 21 and 22. Celebrate this holiday season with the celestial voices of multi-platinum Irish singing sensation Celtic Woman with a full orchestra. Featuring music from the all-female ensemble's most favorite Yuletide songs performed by them over the years.

The new **Sounds of the Season** program ushers in the holiday spirit on Dec. 23 with jazz vocalist **Tammy McCann** in stirring renditions of festive carols, such as "Santa Claus is Comin to Town." *The Nutcracker* will be performed by the ASO in an entirely fresh way—first with Tchaikovsky's original version right next to Duke Ellington's big-band arrangements.

Twas the Night Before Christmas Family Concert is designed for our youngest patrons and their families with a festive mix of carols, along with the score of the classic animated film, *The Snowman*, while it plays on a screen overhead during two shows on Dec. 3.

The **Movies in Concert series**, presented by Invesco QQQ, features beloved films playing on a 40-ft screen overhead while the score is performed live to picture by the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. Patrons can enjoy Macaulay Culkins' hilarious hi-jinks as Kevin McCallister, as John Williams' charming score comes to life in *Home Alone* (Nov. 25-26), or feel the romance warming up as Cameron Diaz, Kate Winslet, Jude Law, and Jack Black act out in *The Holiday* (Dec. 16-17).

Emmy and Golden Globe winner Darren Criss jumpstarts the holiday season on Nov. 21, performing songs from his recent holiday album, *A Very Darren Crissmas*, with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. The show will include big band Christmas classics, novelty tunes, and folk-pop ballads.
