After headlining Atlanta Jazz Festival this past weekend, R&B artist **PJ Morton** announced that he will be joining forces with the **Atlanta Symphony Orchestra (ASO)** for one night on **The Saturday Night Sunday Morning Tour** on **Friday, December 11, 2026**.

About Electric Avenue: The '80s Symphonic Experience with the Atlanta Pops Orchestra

Imagine a one-of-a-kind, high-flying symphonic-rocket made of pure '80s magic and joy. Every detail of this show has been authentically reimagined and energized, featuring some of the most recognizable songs of the decade, including music from Tears for Fears, Toto, Prince, Queen, Duran Duran, Mr. Mister, Phil Collins, Kenny Loggins, David Bowie, George Michael, The Police, A-ha, and more.

About PJ Morton: The Saturday Night Sunday Morning Tour with the ASO

PJ Morton is a soul singer, songwriter, performer and producer based in New Orleans. He is a 6x GRAMMY® -winner and 22x GRAMMY® nominee who has earned numerous nominations for BET, Soul Train and NAACP Image Awards, in addition to selling out countless shows at historic venues like the Apollo Theater and others around the world. On top of running his own record label, Morton Records, and serving as Maroon 5's full-time keyboardist for the past 15+ years, he has collaborated with Stevie Wonder, Erykah Badu, Jon Batiste, Nas, Lil Wayne, JoJo, Jill Scott and many more.

Throughout his transformation from preacher's kid to one of the busiest men in music, PJ Morton has made albums everywhere from Africa to Louisiana, has recorded with everything from a lone piano to a full orchestra, and performed everywhere from church services to the Super Bowl Halftime Show. But until now, one thing he has never done is create a project that captures the full breadth of his artistry, identity and inspirations. On June 19th, 2026, PJ Morton releases *Saturday Night, Sunday Morning*, a double album split in two: one half of R&B (Saturday Night), one half of Gospel (Sunday Morning). Each record features nine new songs that seamlessly coexist, breaking down the barriers of sound, culture and genre that he has always sought to defy.
