


Symphony Orchestra Talent Development Program

One of the most successful music pathway programs in the country, the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra's **Talent Development Program (TDP)** provides 25 young musicians each year with the highest levels of musical training and wraparound support.



For 31 years, the **Talent Development** Program (TDP) has served as a model among arts organizations nationwide, helping more than 150 young musicians secure places at the country's top music schools and conservatories.

Jackson Jeffrey | French Horn

Jackson began playing the French horn seven years ago and has been a TDP member for one year. A member of the Atlanta Symphony Youth Orchestra (ASYO), Jackson has performed with the Emory University Symphony Orchestra, as well as other collegiate symphonies. Jackson will attend the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music to study horn performance.



Gabriel Silva | Trombone

Gabriel began studying the trombone at age ten and has been a member of TDP for four years. A member of ASYO and the Atlanta Youth Wind Symphony (AYWS), Gabriel has attended the Tanglewood Institute and the Youth Orchestra of Los Angeles National Festival, where he served as principal trombone. Gabriel plans to attend the University of Miami to study trombone performance.



Ugo Nwakanma | Trombone

Ugo has played the trombone for seven years and joined TDP three years ago. Ugo is a member of the AYWS and has joined the GMEA Honor Band annually since 2021. He has participated in a variety of programs including the South Fulton Jazz Camp and the Tanglewood Institute Trombone workshop. Ugo plans to attend Vanderbilt University to study trombone performance.



Dylan Gutierrez | Viola

Dylan began playing viola at age eleven and has been a TDP member for three years. He is a member of ASYO and is involved with the Emory Youth Symphony, the GMEA All-State Orchestra, and has attended Interlochen Arts Camp and Green Mountain Chamber Music Festival. Dylan plans to attend the University of Michigan to study viola performance.

Angelica V. Hairston | Class of 2011 | Harp

Angelica is a renowned harpist, educator, and change-maker, known for her fiery performances

and passion for social change. In 2016, she founded *Challenge the Stats*, an organization dedicated to empowering BIPOC artists and amplifying calls for justice on and off the stage. She serves as an Artistic Consultant for the Urban Youth Harp Ensemble and provides free harp instruction to 80 young students in Atlanta.



Daniel Tancredi | Class of 2016 | Double Bass

Daniel is a passionate performer and educator, having attended the Royal College of Music

in London and performed with the BBC Symphony Orchestra and the English National Opera. Recently he was appointed the principal double bass of The Atlanta Opera and began his role as a double bass professor at Georgia State University.



TDP alumnus and Equity Arc CEO **Stanford Thompson** received national acclaim for his

leadership after the cancellation of the Equity Arc Pathways Orchestra's planned performance with the U.S. Marine Band. He and his team transformed the setback into a powerful opportunity to advance the issue of equity in music, attracting hundreds of new donors and securing national media coverage on outlets like 60 Minutes, the Chicago Sun-Times, and CBS News.
